Expanding Access to Care for All



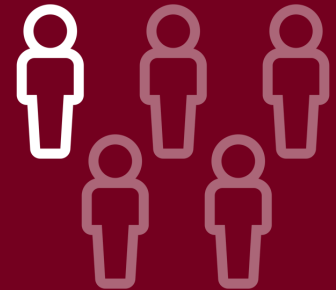
Community health centers (CHCs) are non-profit, mission-driven organizations that provide high quality, comprehensive health care in under-resourced communities, serving all patients, regardless of ability to pay.

In the decade following the Affordable Care Act, health center organizations, sites, and patients grew dramatically.*

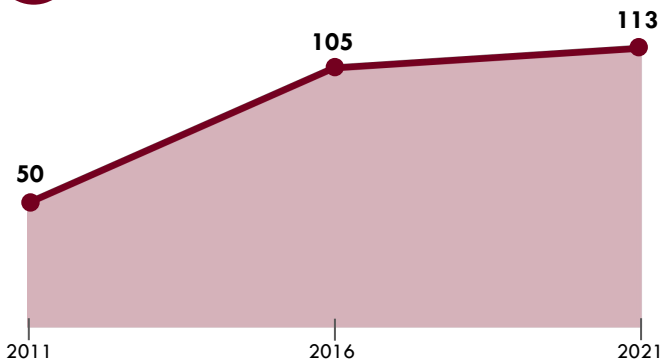

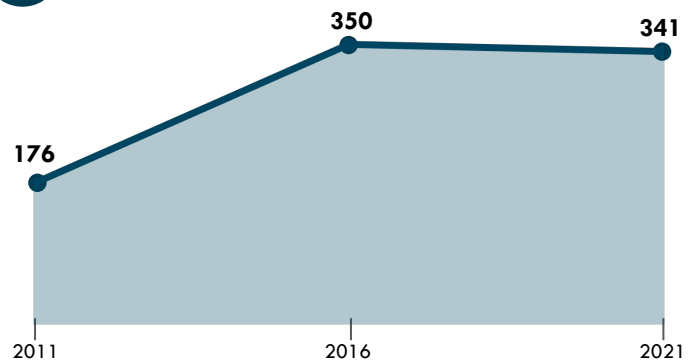
CHCs serve 1 in 5 LA County Residents



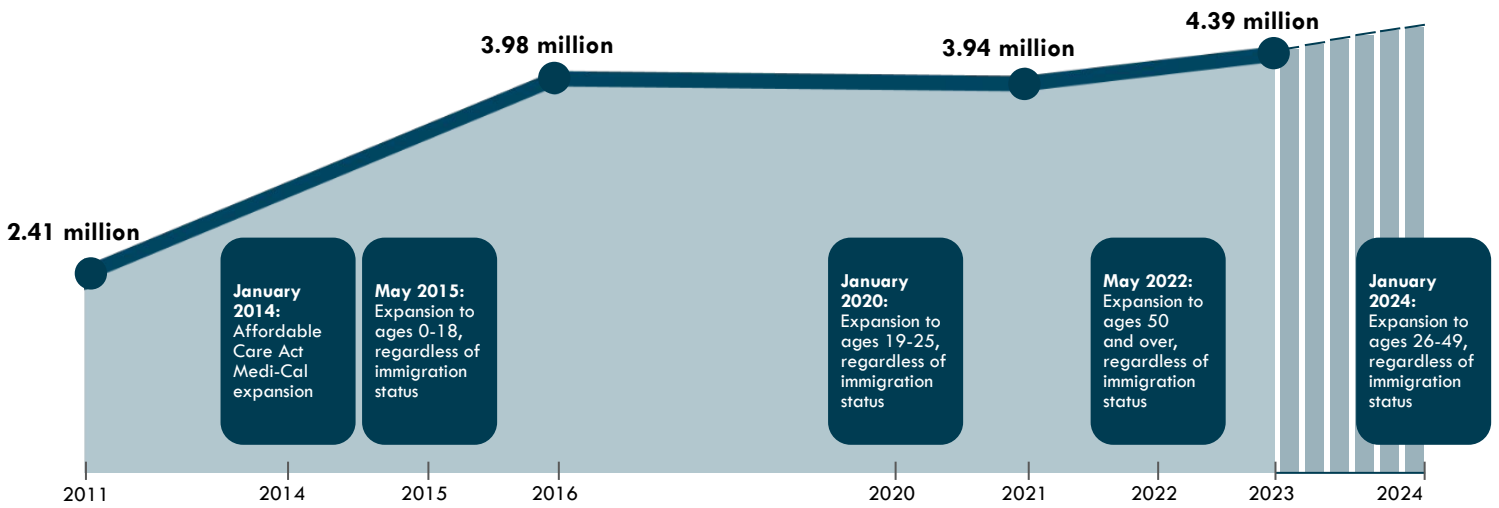
126% growth in CHC organizations



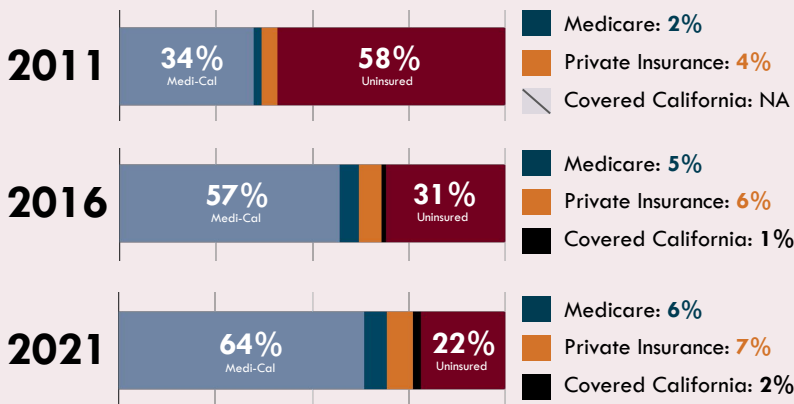
94% increase in number of full-time sites

In the past decade, health center patients went from majority uninsured to majority Medi-Cal.*

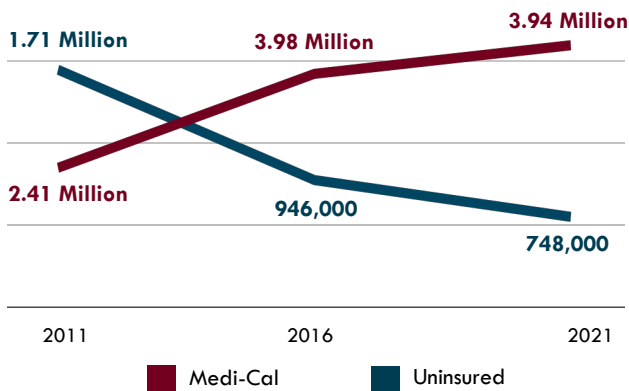


CHCs serve 1 in 3 LA County Residents with Medi-Cal

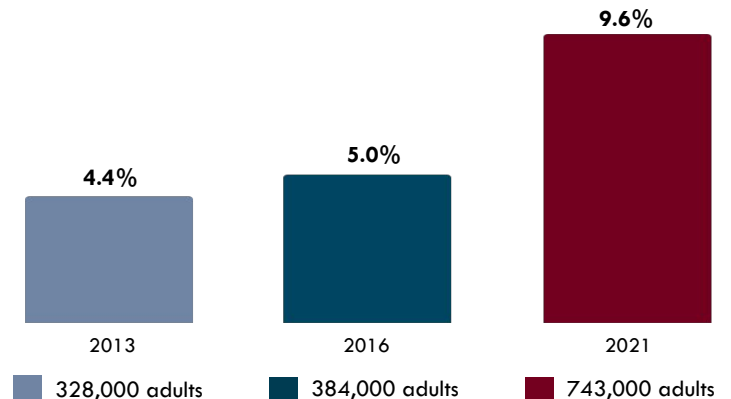


Medi-Cal enrollment in LA County grew by 64%, while difficulty finding care more than doubled.**^
